3.0 COUNCIL BUSINESS

Council Report: Colin explained that all Council business to be discussed at the April 5 meeting.

Allocation of Council Funds of \$3,000 as follows:

- Other projects: seat, flagpole, notice board. Funding to come from CBD fund of \$7,561.34.
- Remaining items for Hall renovations to be applied for in future funding allocations. (Check if we reallocate
 funds from the \$25,866.02 currently earmarked for the picnic area/CBD/Rec Area/Cenotaph Jeannette to
 check with Rachel Lane. Could use this money to resurface hall floor?

Colin McFadzean has also donated \$250 from his business to be distributed to HCDG as it sees fit.

4.0 GENERAL BUSINESS

4.1 Focus #1 – Walkway and Domain

A huge thank you to all that attended the walkway working bee, we had a very productive morning and we achieved what we set out to do. Carpet, stones, and bark laid and spread around railway board, plaques cleaned and secured along with boarder boards, weeds pulled around trees etc. A big thanks to Neil for doing the heavy lifting by tractor. It saved time and our backs!

My wish list for the area ultimately is to completely clear the drain and trees around Levin Street area, the drain is growing trees and old trees a danger. The gorse along the creek side and railway bank is in desperate need of a spray. I would like to see some sort of steps alongside the grandstand as this path is eroding away as is the 'waterway' just past the Stanway end of the walkway. More bark would be nice too.

I will endeavour to organize regular working bees so people in the community for example last Sunday of every month you can come on down.
